# Introduction

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At Waddesdon, we welcome all visitors and strive to make everyone's visit as comfortable and enjoyable as possible. This Access Guide provides a general overview of accessibility at Waddesdon Manor.

For more detailed information, such as floor surfaces, precise dimensions and distances, door widths please see the **Access Specifications** PDF. There you will find photos of stairs, ramps, floors and more, so you can pre-plan your visit to Waddesdon in as much detail as possible.

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## Accessibility at a Glance

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- Accessible toilets in multiple locations.
- Including an accessible Changing Places toilet with a full hoist facility, adult-size height-adjustable changing bed and height-adjustable sink
- Complimentary entry to house and grounds for carers
- Indoor and outdoor wheelchairs available to borrow
- The **shuttle bus** from the car park to the house/grounds is wheelchair accessible.



### **There is level access to:**

- Welcome Pavilion/Visitor Car Park
- The Aviary
- The gardens around the house
- The Parterre
- The Manor (all sides)



### **There is sloped/ramped (can be steep) access to:**

- The Stables
- The Woodland Playground and Woodland Takeaway



### **Inside the house:**

- There are three floors, plus a mezzanine floor (Bachelor's Wing)
- There are lifts, stair ramps and a chairlift
- We have a Quiet Space located within the house away from the visitor route. Please ask a member of staff for access. This is equipped with an armchair, footstool, rug, pop-up tent, drinking water, ear defenders, sunflower lanyards and fidget toys.



### **Hearing:**

- There are induction loops at various indoor locations on our site including all fixed till points.
- Some of our staff are trained in basic BSL. We cannot guarantee that there will be a member of staff trained in BSL on the day of your visit.
- A free audio tour is available on the Bloomberg Connects app.



## **Visual:**

- Many rooms inside the house have dim/low lighting as well as red carpets.
- Large print information booklets are available upon request inside the house.
- The Handling Collection is open from 12pm – 3:30pm on weekdays and 11am – 3:30pm on weekends, subject to volunteer availability.

## **Visitors on the Autistic Spectrum**

- We have PDF guides and visit preparation materials available for visitors on the autistic spectrum.
- As above, the Quiet Space within the house is available to all guests who require privacy.
- We run Relaxed Openings once a month for anyone who would benefit from a limited capacity and relaxed admission times.

# Getting to Waddesdon

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## By Road

For sat nav users, please use the postcode **HP18 0JH**. The entrance to Waddesdon Manor is via Silk Street.


- **From London** (allow 1.5 hours from Central London)
- **From Birmingham** (allow 1.5 hours from the center of Birmingham)
- **From Oxford** (allow 45mins)
- **From Milton Keynes** (allow at least 45mins)



## Parking

The 1,000-space visitor car park has dedicated places for Blue Badge holders and limited mobility. On arrival you will be directed to the Welcome Pavilion and ticket offices. The car park is open air, with a tarmac surface, central spine walking path and is free for all visitors. We recommend using our large visitor car park wherever possible. Silk Street is not a public right of way and is solely for vehicle usage.

**Electric vehicles** - There are four spaces in the visitor car park signposted for the purpose of electric vehicle charging, outside the accessible parking zone. These are not set within wider spaces; however, our staff are happy to assist. Sockets provided are EV Type 2 charging sockets and are free to use. Staff must activate these, so please do let them know at the Welcome Pavilion.



## **By Rail**

Regular trains run from London Marylebone to Aylesbury and Aylesbury Vale Parkway. The nearest train station is Aylesbury Vale Parkway (AVP). A taxi or bus journey is required to get to the Manor, or you may wish to walk or cycle using the Waddesdon Greenway from AVP to the Welcome Pavilion.

## **By Foot**

Access to Waddesdon from the village via foot is not recommended as there are no public rights of way that directly connect Waddesdon village to the Welcome Pavilion. Silk Street is an unlit historical road and as such is not recommended for walking. If you are staying or eating at the Five Arrows Hotel, we do recommend that you park in our large free visitor car park due to the above.

The Waddesdon Greenway connects Aylesbury Vale Parkway to the Welcome Pavilion via a tarmac path, and this can be joined at several points between the two.

## **Local buses**

Local Red Rose bus (16) runs from Aylesbury to Marsh Gibbon via Waddesdon. Please note this is an infrequent service and there are no buses on a Sunday. On arrival in Waddesdon village, walk through the main gates on Silk Street and you will be directed towards the Welcome Pavilion, where you can book tickets for the house and gardens, and can either take the shuttle bus up to the Manor or walk the 1-mile tarmacked footpath, which has a steep hill.

## **Local Taxi Services**

If using a taxi service, we recommend you are dropped off at the Welcome Pavilion. We have dedicated drop off spaces near the exit of the car park, on the right near the Welcome Pavilion.

# On Arrival

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## Welcome Pavilion

All visitors will be directed to the Welcome Pavilion upon on arrival, including those with pre-booked tickets. We strongly advise pre-booking tickets to enable us to best accommodate your needs. Carers accompanying disabled visitors will receive free entry.

If you have booked Premium Parking, this is signposted at the entry on Silk Street.\*please be aware that Premium Parking is not recommended for those with physical access needs, as the ground is not tarmac, and there are no marked accessible bays


There is a very easy slope leading from the car park to the Welcome Pavilion and it is outside, except for the toilets and accessible toilets which are within the building, off a central external corridor.

Bench seating is available at the Welcome Pavilion if you need to take a seat while waiting for the bus.



## Shuttle Bus

A shuttle bus is available to transport passengers from the car park to the North Fountain, and then on to the Stables. The shuttle buses are accessible with a fold out ramp (76cm wide). Staff will be happy to help with any requirements. On each bus there is a dedicated area for wheelchair users and marked limited mobility seats at the front. Each shuttle bus has space for 2 wheelchairs, or up to 2 pushchairs without folding them.



## Toilets and Changing Facilities

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### Where are our accessible and ambulatory toilets?

#### Welcome Pavilion

- Single all gender accessible toilet with step free access.
- Located behind the ticket counters.
- Ambulatory cubicle in male and female toilet.



#### The Tunnel (By the Manor, past the Shop and Coffee Bar)

- Located at the side of the house, beyond the Coffee Bar and Manor Shop. The tunnel, which is slightly sloped, provides access to an accessible toilet on the right, and the male and female toilets further down.
- There is also a parent and baby room available, this is opposite the accessible toilet
- There are baby changing facilities within the female toilet



## The Stables

- There is an accessible toilet located next to the Stables Café, with step free access.
- There is also a parent and baby room located in the stable's courtyard, this does not have a toilet within the room however



## Changing Places Toilet (Inside the Manor)

- Full hoist facility
- Adult-size height-adjustable changing bed
- Height adjustable sink
- Located inside the Manor, through a corridor opposite the interior Manor Shop entrance, signed from the shop and corridor within
- Please ask a member of staff if you need help locating this toilet
- There is a RADAR key available in the shop if you need to access this toilet



## Wheelchairs

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Manual wheelchairs are available to borrow during your visit to Waddesdon. All wheelchairs are given on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be pre-booked.

Outdoor wheelchairs are available to borrow from the **Welcome Pavilion** and at the **North Fountain**, next to the shuttle bus stop. These cannot be taken inside the Manor; however, you may swap to an indoor wheelchair on arrival at the door.

There are indoor wheelchairs available for use inside the Manor. These may not be taken outside as the wheels are not as durable. These wheelchairs are available at the **Main Entrance** of the Manor.

If you find yourself requiring a wheelchair while you are exploring the grounds, please ask a member of staff, and they will be able to assist you in borrowing one.



## First Aiders

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There are always First Aid trained staff on site. If you require First Aid, please let a member of staff know, and they will arrange a First Aider to help you as soon as possible.

## **The Grounds**

We have a laid gravel path from the Welcome Pavilion to the Manor. This path takes you through the ticket check point and arrives at the rear (South Front) of the Manor.



If you arrive on a coach, you will be greeted by a member of staff at the North Fountain drop off location. There are manual outdoor wheelchairs available to borrow at North Fountain.

It is a 100-metre walk, on a flat hard surface, from the North Fountain to the main manor entrance.

### **Graveled areas**

Most parts of the garden have accessible access, with many surfaces/paths tarmacked. However, there are graveled areas in front of the house, on the Parterre, and around the Aviary. Miss Alice's Drive has a rough natural surface, and as such may not be suitable for all access requirements.

## **Steep paths**

You will find steep and uneven paths on the way to the Stables. The boardwalk through the Woodland Playground and the pedestrian path from the Powerhouse to the Stables are steep in places, so may be unsuitable for some mobility requirements. We advise you to use our fully accessible shuttle bus from the North Fountain to get to the Stables.

These steep paths are marked on all maps with chevrons in the slope direction.

## The Aviary

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- Two paths lead from the grounds to the Aviary, which have slight slopes
- There is step free access through most of the Aviary
- There is one small step into the Aviary Grotto
- There is bench seating around the Aviary
- The surface is gravel



## The Parterre

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- The Parterre is located at the rear (South Front) of the house
- The surface is gravel
- Stone steps in the Parterre lead down to fountains and planting
- The planted areas can be accessed step free from the eastern end of the Parterre



## The Manor Shop

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The Manor Shop is located on the east side of the house, by the Coffee Bar and is accessible from the grounds. There is ramped/sloped access at the shop exterior, there is a slight lip on this. Inside the shop, there are two steps leading to the Wine Shop, with a portable ramp available. There are induction loops in both shops at till points.



## The Manor Restaurant and Terrace

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The Manor Restaurant is located inside the manor building, on the east side. There is an entrance via the shop and via the large glass paneled doors.


From the external entrance, there is ramped/sloped access. There is step free access within the restaurant.

There is no toilet directly inside the restaurant, but there is a Changing Places toilet nearby (within 50m), on the same floor (RADAR key required) or our male and female toilets, and parent and child toilet, are just down the stairs at the end of the corridor.

Disability adapted cutlery is available upon request.

A portable hearing loop is available on request. Please note that, due to the acoustics in the Restaurant, background noise may cause some interference. However, we can take payment at tills with fixed loops in the Shop.

There are no braille or large print menus available, but please ask a member of staff and they will be happy to help.



## The Powerhouse

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- The Powerhouse is located opposite the Coffee Bar and Manor Shop
- Introductory films with subtitles play inside on a loop
- It is accessible via a sloped pathway, which is slightly steep
- Inside, there is level access



## The Stables

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The Stables are located down the hill from the main manor building, accessed via some steep paths. Visitors who do not want to use these paths can use the shuttle bus – either from the visitor car park or bus stop located at the North Fountain.

- The bus stop is in front of the Stables courtyard
- There is bench seating available for use while waiting for the bus
- There is step free access throughout the courtyard, Coach House Gallery, Café and Takeaway
- The surface around the edge of the Stables is cobblestones; the center of the courtyard is gravel





# Woodland Playground

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The Woodland Playground is located between the Conservation Hub and the Stables. The Playground includes equipment designed for both younger and older children.

## Access to the Playground:

### From the Stables Courtyard:

- There are 9 steps, with a handrail
- Or visitors can use a ramp/slope, with a handrail
- When you reach the top of the ramp/steps, there is a steep slope into the Playground



### From the Conservation Hub:

- There is step free access
- There is a slope/ramp with a handrail which is quite steep in places (-14°)



### Inside the Playground:

- The surface is bark chipping
- There are slopes throughout, including steep slopes
- The slopes have a boardwalk surface, with handrails on differing sides throughout



## At a Glance: Accessibility inside the house

- A staff member is required to operate all lifts.
- There are eight manual wheelchairs available to borrow for use inside the house. This can be arranged with staff at the main entrance, and are provided on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Only two visitors who cannot self-evacuate are permitted above or below the ground floor at any time. In the event of an evacuation, staff will assist those who are unable to self-evacuate out of the manor via evacuation sledges.
- For conservation reasons, many rooms have dim/low lighting
- The floor surface inside the house is mainly carpets/rugs, with some wooden flooring and flagstones.
- Most of the rooms have red carpeted floors and red ropes, which can cause visual disorientation or sensory sensitivity for some visitors.




## Ground Floor

Route Length: Approx. 200m




# First Floor

Route Length: Approx. 50m




Please note that the chair lift to access the second floor is located on the opposite side of the building and does not lead directly into the Treasury. A walk of approximately 5 minutes is necessary between the chair lift and the Treasury. Access will be supervised by a staff member.

The visitor must be able to transfer themselves into a chair to be able to use the chair lift.

## **Inside the house**

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### **House entrances and exits.**

There are foldable ramps for both sets of steps at the main entrance to the House, allowing access for wheelchair and mobility scooter users.

On occasion, we may request that a mobility scooter or wheelchair user transfer into one of our house wheelchairs upon arrival at the house entrance. There are several narrow corridors and doorways in the house, and the historic lift may not be able to bear the weight of a modern mobility scooter or wheelchair. The wheels may also be exceptionally muddy during the winter months. However, if for any reason this isn't possible, you are welcome to use your own scooter or wheelchair on the ground floor. We have eight wheelchairs suitable for use inside the house which are available at the main entrance on a first-come, first-served basis. Liquids are not permitted inside the house except for medical purposes. If you require water, please ask a member of staff who will direct you to where it is permitted to drink.



## **Safety and emergency evacuation procedure**

For safety reasons, we can only allow two visitors who cannot self-evacuate above or below the ground floor at the same time. On busy days, some waiting time may be required during your visit.

We have an emergency evacuation procedure in place for those who are unable to self-evacuate.

## **Seated areas**

Seating is available throughout the house. Please ask a member of staff to point out the appropriate chairs if needed. Some of the walkways through the rooms are quite narrow, and to avoid congestion, we do not allow carry chairs or seat sticks to be used inside the house. Walking frames are permitted inside the house.

## Stairs within the house



The first and second floors, as well as the Bachelors' Wing, are all accessible using the main spiral staircases.

- There are 42 steps between the ground and first floor
- There are 38 steps between the first and second floor
- The height of the steps is 14cm
- There is a rope handrail on both sides
- The stairs' surfaces are red carpet



There is a separate staircase, containing a sharp bend, that leads from the rear of the Bachelors' Wing to the corridor by the Manor Restaurant and Manor Shop, and then down to the tunnel toilets.

- There are 26 steps between the Bachelors' Wing and the ground floor
- The height of the steps is 15cm
- There is a handrail on both sides
- There is a red-carpet runner on the stairs




## Lifts within the house

There are two lifts within the house. A staff member is required to operate both lifts.

Visitors will be accompanied by a staff member in the lift to the first floor, where they can continue their visit on their own. When they have finished, they will be accompanied upstairs to the Treasury via the lift and chairlift. They will then be accompanied to the mezzanine level to view the Bachelors' Wing. To exit the manor, the visitor will be accompanied out either via the basement or the main entrance

Visitors requiring the lift may ask a staff member or volunteer for access.

### The Main Lift



- This lift also gives access to the Wine Cellar, accessible toilet, standard toilets, and the parent and baby room in the basement, as well as the exhibitions on the second floor (in conjunction with the chair lift).
- Our historic lift has limited space, and not all scooters or wheelchairs can be accommodated. We will be able to advise on whether your mobility aid will fit in the lift at the point of admission to the house. The lift can carry a maximum of six persons. The door consists of a grill that slides shut.

To access the Treasury on the second floor, visitors are taken in the main lift to a mezzanine floor, where visitors will then need to be able to transfer themselves into the chair lift.



### The Chair Lift

- Please note this chair lift is situated on the opposite side of the Manor to the second-floor exhibition rooms and Treasury. It does not take you directly into these rooms. It

can take between 5-10 minutes to access the exhibitions rooms and Treasury. The maximum weight for this chair lift is 120kg.

## The Wine Cellars

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
The Wine Cellars are accessible only with a house ticket. Entry is along the visitor route within the house. The Wine Cellars are occasionally closed for private events.

There is an accessible route to the Wine Cellar. Please contact a member of staff to use this route. It goes through the basement of the House and requires a member of staff to accompany you. Visitors may be asked on arrival to change to a manual house wheelchair depending on the size and weight of their wheelchair.

### Stairs down to the Wine Cellars



- There are 15+ steps down to the Cellars.
- The height of the steps is 20cm, and there is a handrail on one side the whole way down that interchanges from the right and left
- The width of the stairs only permits one person to pass at a time.
- Once inside the Wine Cellars, there is step-free access throughout.
- There is seating available inside.
- The lighting level is low/dim, and the stairs are lit with low level lighting.



## Assistance Dogs

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All recognised assistance dogs are welcome at Waddesdon Manor, within the house and grounds. They are also welcome on our shuttle buses. Dog bowls can be found at the Welcome Pavilion, Stables and outside the Manor Shop. For a bowl of water elsewhere, please ask a member of staff and they will arrange it for you.



Non-assistance dogs may visit the grounds, except for the Aviary, Powerhouse and Woodland Playground. For further information please look on our website for our 'Doggy dos and don'ts', and download a dog-friendly map. <https://waddesdon.org.uk/your-visit/plan-your-day/bringing-your-dog/>



## Blind and partially sighted visitors

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For conservation reasons, many of the rooms inside the house have low lighting. Please allow sufficient time for your eyes to adjust, particularly when using stairs. Please be aware that many of the rooms inside the house are furnished with red carpet and use low red and gold rope barriers. Some visitors find this a visually disorientating interior and have difficulty discerning distance. There are free information booklets available inside the main entrance and an audio tour on the **Bloomberg Connects** app.

### Collection Handling Sessions

We offer the opportunity to handle a number of objects with different materials and textures. These sessions run daily, subject to volunteer availability, and can be tailored to visitors with visual impairments. To guarantee the handling collection will be available during your visit, please get in touch on 01296 820 414. Staff are not trained in audio description.



## Deaf or hard of hearing visitors

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Some of our staff and volunteers are trained in basic British Sign Language (BSL). However, we cannot guarantee that someone trained in BSL will be onsite during your visit.

All introductory films shown in the Powerhouse have subtitles.

There are free information booklets for the house, providing details about the rooms and their contents.

You can download the **Smartify** application as guide to the Waddesdon Collection. Using Smartify, you can hold up your smart phone camera to an artwork within the house, and the app will provide you with textual information about the piece. Waddesdon also uses the **Bloomberg Connects** app.

### Where are our induction loops?

- **The Stables Café and Stables Takeaway**
  - There is a fixed loop at both till counters
- **Welcome Pavilion**
  - There is a fixed hearing loop at two of the counters. These are the low-level counters on the far left and far right.
- **The Manor Shop**
  - There is a fixed loop at the till counters
- **Catering outlets**
  - There is a fixed loop at the Coffee Bar at the Manor
  - There is a fixed loop at the Stables Café
- **The Manor**
  - There is a fixed loop inside the Manor by the main entrance

## Visitors on the Autistic Spectrum

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We offer Relaxed House Openings for neurodivergent visitors and their family, friends or carers. During this time, we have a limited capacity and relaxed entry and exit times. We also have a My Visit Checklist available to download via this page. Please see our website for details.

Our dedicated Quiet Space is located away from the visitor route and offers a private place for visitors experiencing sensory overload. Fidget toys are available to borrow and free copies of the sensory map for the grounds are available to take away.

For those seeking a quiet space within the Waddesdon grounds, the Rose Garden and the grounds surrounding the Aviary offer tranquil areas.

### Red Carpets

For visitors who are sensitive to certain colours, please note that most rooms inside the House have bright red carpets and ropes. Some rooms have red wallpaper, and the walls, floors and furnishings of the Bachelors' Wing are predominantly red.

To find out which rooms do not have red carpet or walls, please see our Manor Floor Plans on page 24, 25, 26.

## ***The Wedding Cake***

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- The *Wedding Cake* is a satellite site on the estate. It is accessible via shuttle bus or via the footpath down from the Stables. There is stepped or sloped access, please be aware the slope is gravel and uneven, and the steps are historic, and have handrails on one side only.
- One manual wheelchair is available to borrow from inside the *Cake*.
- The upper three floors of the *Wedding Cake* are only accessible via steps. There is a handrail on one side of each staircase inside the *Cake*.
- *Wedding Cake* leaflets (provided to visitors by staff) are currently only available in one text size and are in English only
- Tours are currently delivered in spoken English only.
- Dogs (other than assistance dogs) are not permitted inside the *Cake*.

## ***The Dairy***

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- All of the walking paths at the site are gravel, there are grass areas and a few paved areas between
- The path from the bus stop to the entry gate is flat and tarmacked. There is a walk of approximately up to five minutes from the bus stop to the entry gate.
- Seating is limited, please let a staff member know if you need to sit down
- There are male and female staff toilets with step-free access through the kitchen inside the Dairy, all visitors will need to be accompanied by a member of staff as these areas are locked when not in use
- There is an accessible unisex toilet

## ***The Water Gardens***

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- The gravel path leading from the Dairy to the Water Gardens is gravel. There are also a few steps by the *Lafite* sculpture. Avoiding this path requires visitors to walk on the grass: there is a small but steep gradient on this route.
- The path around the Water Gardens is narrow in places. The path can also become rather muddy following bad weather.

## Information for Families

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Pushchairs are welcome in the grounds. Prams and pushchairs are not allowed in the house as the visitor route is narrow and they may inadvertently cause damage. For safety reasons children may not be carried on your shoulders during your house visit. Hip-carrying infant seats are available to borrow at the House entrance free of charge.

Baby-changing and feeding facilities can be found at the Stables and in the tunnel by the Manor Shop, within the parent and child toilet. Bottle feeding is not permitted within the house due to the risk of accidental spillages causing damage to Waddesdon's delicate textile collections. Please ask any member of staff for details or directions to our designated baby feeding facilities. Breast feeding is welcomed anywhere on site.

Under-fives can bring small bicycles into the grounds but please keep to the pathways. These can be taken on our visitor shuttle buses. Adult and larger children's bikes must be stored in the bike rack in the Premium Car Park. Please note that e-bike batteries cannot be taken inside ANY building on site and must remain outside. Waddesdon cannot accept responsibility for stolen items.

The Conservation Hub sits at the top of the Playground. It is surrounded by gravel and has ramped access through standard width doors. Our team will be happy to come and discuss anything with you outside.

Our playground winds through trees from our Conservation Hub to the Stables, making the most of the natural environment. Little ones can enjoy the springers, swings and multi-play items at the bottom of the hill. At the top is our bird's nest swing, for those who want gentler play. Older children can clamber over the climbing frames. Access is included with your grounds ticket. There are toilets and drinking water at the Stables, and drinking water only at the Conservation Hub.

## Food and Dietary Requirements

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Please let our restaurant and café staff know if you have any special dietary requirements and they will do their best to accommodate your needs.

There are vegetarian, vegan, dairy free and gluten free options available at the Stables. Gluten-free bread and ice cream cones are available on request at the

Stables Café.
